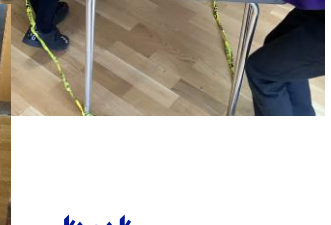

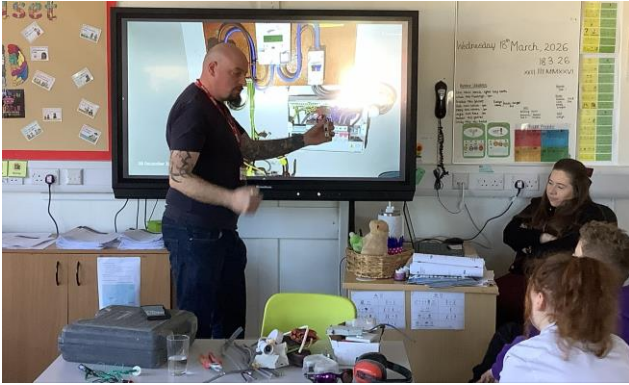
In addition to the workshops, there was a lot of great work going on in classrooms as children explored the world through Science and Maths investigations.

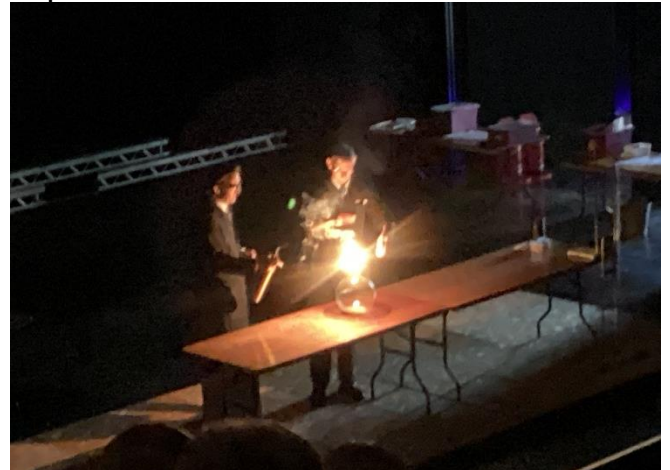

Year 5 visited Wellington College to watch their Chemistry Spectacular Show.

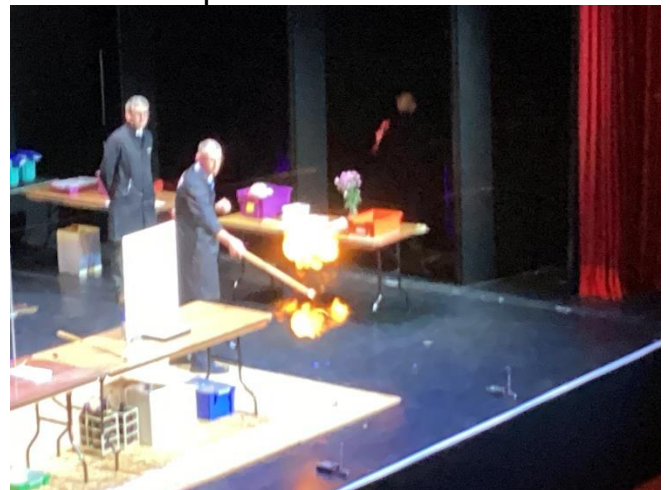


It was an amazing show full of science experiments.

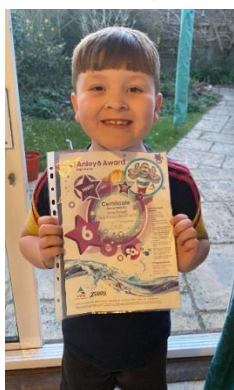

Accidents remain one of the leading causes of serious injury for children. Everyday environments such as homes and schools contain hazards that curious children naturally explore. Behaviours like putting objects in their mouths, touching hot surfaces, or experimenting with things they do not yet understand can quickly lead to harm.

The Child Accident Prevention Trust is a UK charity working to reduce accidental injuries among children. Their online resource centre provides a range of free materials for professionals, including factsheets, posters and activity resources covering risks such as burns, poisoning, choking hazards and road safety. 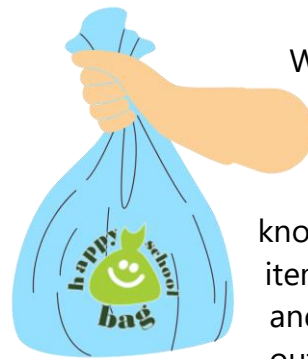

# School Gates Change

## PLEASE READ

Over the past weeks, we have become increasingly concerned that some children are being dropped off very early to wait in the school playground unattended. CCTV footage has noted some children sharing phones, playing football (on one occasion causing damage to the building) and otherwise gathering together completely unattended. We've also had incidents of children talking to passers-by at this time. We are concerned that we cannot keep children safe before the school doors open.

As a result, going forward, the school gates will **not open until 8.30am** and will close at **8.45am**. Staff will be on duty throughout this time. Children arriving outside of these times will need to enter the school through the school office, so we know they are here and can keep them safe. Our breakfast club operates from 7.45am. Please ask in the office if you require more details or a registration form.

Likewise, in the afternoon, the gates will open at 3.10pm and **close again at 3.30pm**. This keeps our children in P.E. lessons and outdoor activities safe, as once the gates open, anyone could enter! In addition, as the summer months arrive, our after-school club will want to spend more time outside, so we need to ensure the school is secure for them. **Thank you for helping us to keep our children safe.**
