

## RESEARCH IDEAS

- Global Chocolate Trade – Research which countries produce and consume the most chocolate. Present your findings in a chart or map.
- Jobs Around the World – Compare the jobs people do in your local area with those in the Ivory Coast. What are the differences and similarities?
- Exploring Peace – Look at how different religions or cultures understand and practise peace. Can you find quotes or images that represent their ideas?

## OUTDOOR LEARNING

- Cocoa Farming Walk – Go on a walk and imagine what it would be like to farm cocoa in a hot, tropical climate. What would be different to the UK?
- Fair Trade Hunt – In your kitchen, check how many products have the Fairtrade logo. Make a tally chart or graph.
- Peaceful Nature Time – Spend some time quietly observing nature. Can you find something symmetrical, something colourful, and something that moves gently?

## PATTERNS OF LIFE

### MUSIC OPPORTUNITIES

- Create a Soundtrack – Use simple percussion or body sounds to create an accompaniment to the song Kisne Banaaya. Can you match rhythms to the meaning of the lyrics?
- Sing Along – Practise singing Kisne Banaaya at home. Try to learn some of the Hindi lyrics!
- Instrument Exploration – If you have access to any percussion instruments, explore different sounds and try to create a mini ensemble with your family.

## THINGS TO DO AND MAKE

- Chocolate Journey Poster – Create a visual timeline showing the journey from cocoa pod to chocolate bar. Include maps, drawings, and information about fair trade.
- Cocoa Farm Model – Make a small diorama or 3D model of a cocoa farm in the Ivory Coast. Use natural or recycled materials to show the trees, pods, and people working.
- Peace Artwork – Reflecting on Buddhist ideas of peace, create a piece of artwork or a poem that shows what peace means to you.
- Fabric design – try and use some pieces of material and your stitching skills to create something beautiful.

### PLACES TO VISIT

- Local Fairtrade Shops – Visit a shop that sells Fairtrade products and identify which items come from the Ivory Coast or other tropical regions.
- Athletics Track – head to a local park to try out your running, throwing, and jumping for athletics.
- A Quiet Garden or Nature Space – Find a peaceful place to reflect, draw, or write poetry inspired by Buddhist meditation practices.
